 - Assessment and reporting
 - Teachers collect a wide body of learning outcome evidence over the term
 - Report cards are indicators of curriculum expectations and are based on not meeting expectations, basic, good or excellent understanding of the curriculum. This is different from previous standards set as "at", "above" or "below" grade level.
 - Starting Jan 1, CBE has been moving to standardized comments on the report cards. In the past years teachers were able to write free-form paragraphs, but going forward all comments will be in point form. The reason for this is uniformity and consistency across teachers and grades.
 - Zero as a grade has been taken out of the CBE for missing work or being late, as it does not reflect the student's understanding of curriculum. This is effective across K-12. If no work is handed in, student has time to hand in by a set deadline or before last day of semester. For no work handed in, the grade will be "Not complete" or "No evaluation", not zero or 1. Read carefully through the report cards and reach out to teacher or admin with any questions.
 - Kindergarten students will receive the full report card this semester, not just literacy and numeracy as at halfway mark.
 - Report cards are going live for viewing on Jun 25.
 - It should be noted that curriculum has changed quite significantly in the past year, so there are still gaps in students' abilities and CBE expectations. Most noticeable gaps are in numeracy. All students are being supported by admin and staff and parents will be notified well in advance if their children are not meeting expectations before Jun 25.



- Students are no longer being held back in grades. There are a lot of factors that go into having a child repeat a grade, but it has been shown to be detrimental to children socially and has not resulted in much academic improvement. Moreover, it has been shown to affect childrens' self-confidence and made them perceive themselves as a "hopeless case".
- One of the only cases where holding a student back could be beneficial, is at the start of Kindergarten, for children who may have to start right around when they turn 6. In that case, waiting a year can be helpful.
- West Springs School has multiple programs and ways to support students who may need extra attention and help – via literacy intervention teachers, focus groups, etc.
 Extra support is offered as much as possible in a way that doesn't make students feel singled out and isolated from their peers.

Music presentation – Classroom sharing - Mr. Vooys

- Music class is a mix of singing, theory skills, playing instruments and learning about different composers and bands, with a sprinkling of drama, movement games and skills.
- Some highlights include: djembe drumming (Gr 1-3), ukulele and melody writing (Gr 4), xylophones (Gr 2-4), choir (Gr 3-4). The choir this year was the largest that Mr. Vooys ever directed.
